Boundary of the Ahupuaa of Lawai

Received the following petition

Honolulu July 8th 1873Hon^{ble} Kunoaw McBrydeCommissioner of Boundaries for the Island of Hawaii
Sir

I am directed by Queen Emma to make application to you to settle and define the boundaries of the Ahupuaa of Lawai situated on the Island of Hawaii belonging to Hiram's widow of James R. Young it is bounded on one side by Koloa which boundary was settled some time since and on the other side by Kalahou lately surveyed by Mr Gay and which survey was well accepted by the Crown Commissioners.

This boundary being in dispute the Commissioner of Boundaries appointed for the appearance of both sides on the disputed part near the sea beach, when both boundaries were pointed out that claimed by Lawai by a native called Mokuake, and that claimed by Kalahou by a native called Kuaia, the commission in comparing the evidence, found that the small piece of rocky land claimed by Lawai near the beach from Kalahou was more than compensated by the gain to the latter land Mankoa and advised the Crown Commissioners to accept the boundary as pointed out and claimed by the Queen of the Lawai through their witnesses Mokuake and others.

Received intimation from J. O. Dennis Crown Commissioner to accept the boundary of Kalahou as pointed out by the natives of Lawai, which was done and the following decision rendered,

Decision

18th Aug 1873

Commencing on the sea beach at a point called Mawaloo, & thence running Mankoa across a gully and point of Rocks to a place called Luawahine below, thence to a large pile of stones

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called Makoulii thence to top of Ridge called Kapuhikama thence
 down side of hill to a rock called Upopo thence crossing stream
 and along foot of spur to side of stream called Haliipae thence
 to a large stone called Haliipae, situated between two streams
 thence up a narrow ridge to two stones set into the ground, thence
 to Kamalewaa, thence passing near a large hole called, Ka
 Kainahoa, thence to Haleana, thence along ridge across gully
 up and along top of ridge, thence down side of hill crossing
 gully and on to spur, thence crossing gully to spur called
 Kappana, thence to Pihali, and on to a large rock called
 Leho, thence to another rock called Leho, thence crossing
 stream and through clump of trees to side of grass spur
 running down from Nueh, thence crossing gully and up
 side of range to a saddle or low part in main ridge and
 thence to a spake called Pukolo and thence down the
 Koloa boundary to the Sea

 gully and point of rocks to a place called Kalesho-
 pilau. Thence N 22.52° E 2457 links to a large pile of stones
 called Makoulii. Thence N. 4° 41' E 3188 links to top of ridge
 called Kapuhikama, thence N 24.53° E 1258 links, down side of
 hill and over pali to rock called Upopo, thence S 84° E 584
 links crossing stream and along foot of spur, to side of stream
 called Haliipae. Thence N 30.0° E 168 links crossing stream
 to a large stone called Haliipae situated between two streams
 Thence N 9.47° E 792 links, running up a narrow ridge

This boundary being in dispute the Commissioners of Boundaries appointed for the appearance of both sides on the disputed part near the sea beach, when both boundaries were pointed out that claimed by Lawai by a native called Mokuiake, and that claimed by Kalahae by a native called Kasia, the commission on comparing the evidence, found that the small piece of rocky land claimed by Lawai near the beach from Kalahae was more than compensated by the gain to the latter land Manda and advised the Crown Commissioners to accept the boundary as pointed out and claimed by the Queen of the Lawai through their witnesses Mokuiake and others

Received intimation from J. O. Dennis Crown Commission to accept the boundary of Kalahae as pointed out by the natives of Lawai, which was done and the following decision rendered,

Decision

18th Aug 1873

Commencing on the sea beach at a point called Manda, & thence running Manda across a gully and point of Rocks to a place called Luvawahine place, thence to a large pile of stone

called Makaulii thence to top of Ridge called Kapuhikona thence down side of hill to a rock called Upopo thence crossing stream and along foot of spur to side of stream called Haliipae thence to a large stone called Haliipae, situated between two streams thence up a narrow ridge to two stones set into the ground, thence to Kamaitewa, thence passing near a large hole called, Ka Kaimahoa, thence to Haleana, thence along ridge across gully up and along top of ridge, thence down side of hill crossing gully and on to spur. Thence crossing gully to spur called Kapaana, thence to Pihali, and on to a large rock called Leho, thence to another rock called Leho, thence crossing stream and through clump of trees to side of grassy slope running down from Bush, thence crossing gully and up side of range to a saddle or low part in main ridge and thence to a spike called Piholo and thence down the Kolu boundary to the Sea.

Notes of Survey Lawai & Keke situated in the District of Kona Island of Hawaii

The south west boundary of this land commences at the sea beach at a point called Mwanaloa and joining the SE corner of Kalahou and runs thence N. 0. 5 E 6780 links crossing a gully and point of rocks ~~at~~ to a place called Kaluakou-pilaw. Thence N 22. 52 E 2457 links to a large pile of stones called Makaulii. Thence N. 9. 41 E 3188 links to top of ridge called Kapuhikona, thence N 24. 53 E 1238 links, down side of hill and over pali to rock called Upopo, thence S 84 E 584 links crossing stream and along foot of spur, to side of stream called Haliipae. Thence N 30. 0 E. 168 links crossing stream to a large stone called Haliipae situated between two streams. Thence N 9. 47 E 792 links, running up a sharp narrow ridge

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to two stones set into the ground, thence $N 20.29^{\circ} W$ 940 links along east side of range, to a tall stone set into the ground, thence $N 15.8^{\circ} W$ 1360 links, to a stone with a hole set into the ground at a place called Kamaulewa, thence $N 15.20^{\circ} E$ 1020 links to two stones set into the ground on the south side of Government road 20 links to the west of a large hole in the ground and called Kakaiaiwaka, thence $N 22.17^{\circ} W$ 1506 links to place called Haleana, thence $N 39.33^{\circ} W$ 749 links along side of ridge to marker cut in ground thence $N 33.16^{\circ} W$ 1680 links down the side of ridge and across hollow to top of ridge thence $N 33.0^{\circ} W$ 439 links, thence $N 16.27^{\circ} E$ 1025 links along top of ridge, thence $N 8.0^{\circ} E$ 1787 links, down side of hill, and crossing gully, and on to top of spur, thence $N 3.12^{\circ} W$ 456 links, $N 9.0^{\circ} W$ 1590 links crossing gully and old road to the top of spur called Kapena, thence $N 12.38^{\circ} W$ 1333 links to place called Pihali $N 19.14^{\circ} W$ 410 links $N 17.39^{\circ} W$ 826 links to a large rock called Lihū, $N 21.0^{\circ} W$ 282 links $N 30.10^{\circ} W$ 295 links to a large rock called Lapa, thence $N 10.36^{\circ} E$ 5420 links crossing stream and through clump of trees to side of grassy spur running out of bush, thence $N 52.36^{\circ} E$ 8000 links crossing a gully and along up side of range to a saddle on main ridge a little to the west of a hill called Pūhōke, and called Kalaalea at which place this land joins the land of Kolow and is the North end of this lava.

The Eastern boundary of this land commences at a point on the sea shore at a sand stone rock on the west side of Kūkaiaia harbor and runs thence $N 31.4^{\circ} W$ 580 links to a corner of a stone wall marking road way thence $N 28.0^{\circ} W$ 2668 links to a red hill, to the west of Cepeo stream, thence $N 20.12^{\circ} W$ 7275 links to a stone set into the ground, on the south side of a large hole called Kapelele, thence $N 23.43^{\circ} W$ 1516 links to an iron bolt set into the ground, in a hole close to a road thence $N 0.13^{\circ} W$ 700 links to a hole at Pūmakamalie, $N 20.35^{\circ} W$ 450 links to a hole at Namahana, $N 0.1^{\circ} W$ 1840 links to top of ridge called Kamahou $N 7.30^{\circ} E$ 2065 links crossing a gully and over a ridge to a hole on side of hill, at trench

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From two mile stone on south side of highway
 west road from where the following places bear a sharp peak called
 Halo on ridge back of Mahaulapei N 72. 56. 8. the top of Peukolo
 on this boundary N 8. 40. W the highest peak of Kalulu N 9. 30. W
 thence from two mile stone N 19. 35. W 53. 80 links across flat to the
 top of a red hill called Kaulali at Kahiwahia ridge, thence
 N 13. 45. 6. 1830 links to the top of a red bluff N 55. 0. W 890 links
 along ridge from red bluff N 49. 45. W 940 links along said
 ridge, N 39. 46. W 2335 links along said ridge to top of a
 hill called Kalamoa at Kamani thence N 17. 30. 6. 103. 00 links
 to Peukolo the watershed of the ridge, being the boundary be-
 tween this land and Koloa, thence following along the water-
 shed of ridge, in a north west direction to Kalalea gaps
 the north corner of this land and containing and area of 8
 acres, at nearly all the place stations on the survey three
 stones have been set into the ground or fences cut &
 these bearings herein recorded are 8. 31. 8 of true North
