# Boundary of the Ahupoua of Kalahoue

Wahiaua Kawai.

My dear Sir

I have this day made application to you to settle all the boundaries of the crown lands on the Island of Hawaii that had not previously been defined also the title of Clele belonging to Estate of M. Kekuanani and the Ahupoua of Lawai belonging to Hihini.

If there are any other lands belonging to the Estate of N. K. Kamamaka or M. Kekuanani which have not had their boundaries defined I will make another application. I find that Wahiaua has not been settled and will make application with this.

Waimea I find includes the lands of Pokii, Maawa, and Ketahaa so I do not make application to define the boundaries separately as we do not think it necessary unless there may be other lands within waimea than those belonging to the Crown.

On the receipt of the above application gave notice to J. W. Gay surveyor of my intention to have the boundary of Kalahoue settled and defined and summoned the natives on that land and the adjoining lands to give evidence on the 19<sup>th</sup> July 1873. The parties appeared and Mr. Gay handed to the court a survey of said land which he had been directed to make some months previously by J. O. Dominis. said survey was found to be correct, not only by the evidence of the several natives Kaniapahe, Naoua, & others, but by taking them on to the land and pointing out the different marks and stations and from said evidence in court and on the ground the following decision was rendered




The Western boundary of this land commences at the sea beach at a point called Poked and adjoining Wahiaua at a stone the

shape of an hour glass thence to a place called Puahani, thence to a place called Keahua, thence to a place Puulohole a trap of stone thence to Kalakauhaka, thence to Kubaauahoa thence to Mahohi wale, thence to a place called Kahaliki, thence across several small gullies, thence through dam at Boiling down establishment and across government road to a place called Kawauhaka, where there is a large stone, thence up past stockyard to a stone with a split in it called Waipapaaina, thence crossing a gully several times to a large rock with a split in it thus called Kapuna thence up through bush to a large tree on top of ridge called Kapuwahini, thence the boundary of this land goes through forest on a ridge to a high peak called Kahiki

The Eastern Boundary of this land commences on the sea shore and adjoining Lawai at a point called Manaloa at a stone there. It thence crosses a gully to a point of rocks and on to a point of rocks place called Luahinipilao, thence down side of hill and over a small pali to a pile of stones called Ma-kaukai thence to a place on top of ridge called Kapuhikau thence down side of hill and over a small pali to a rock called Upoupa thence crossing a stream and along foot of spur to side of stream called Haliepa, thence running up a sharp narrow spur to two stones set into the ground, thence along east side of ridge to a stone set into the ground thence to a stone with a knob at a place called Mailoa thence to thence stone set into the ground on the south side of the government Road, thence to Haleana, thence along side of ridge to a marker cut into the ground thus  thence down side of hill and across hollow to the top of a ridge thence along top of ridge + down the side of a hill crossing a gully and on to the top of a spur, thence crossing a gully and old road to the top of a spur called Kapuna thence to a place called Pihale, thence to a large rock called Leku thence to crossing another rock called Leku thence across gully and up through a small clump of trees to a grassy spur running into the bush, thence down the eastern side of grassy spur and along side of range to junction of Lawai with Kela at a place in saddle of ridge called  thence along Kela boundary to top of high peak Kahiki

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


## Notes of Survey Kulakeo

### Crown Land

Surveyed on Magnet's Reading 8 1/2 East

The Western Boundary of this land commences at the sea beach at a point called Kuhoe and joining Wahawa'a at a large stone the shape of an hour glass. 400 links from the sea beach (see plan) and runs thence  $N 0.13^{\circ} E$  <sup>1193</sup> links to a place called Owahani. Thence  $N 10.5^{\circ} E$  <sup>1799</sup> links to a place called Keahua. Thence  $N 7.50^{\circ} E$  4460 links to a place called Puulolele a square of stones with stones set into their centre thus  Thence  $N 21.42^{\circ} E$  2567 links to a place called Kalahawaha, from whence near Ahealikea Peak  $N 39.29^{\circ} W$ . Pohakoa Peak  $N 8.42^{\circ} W$  Thence from Kalahawaha  $N 18.10^{\circ} E$  2933 links to a place called Hukawakoa. Thence  $N 28.58^{\circ} E$  1663 links to a place called Wahakoa. Thence  $N 18.13^{\circ} E$  2830 links to a place called Kahalekii. Thence  $N 17.26^{\circ} E$  4690 links crossing several small gullies and through Judge McBraydes dam at Pointing down Establishment, and close past the west side of Bridge on Government road to place called Kawahaha, a large stone from whence near Pohakoa Peak  $N 39.56^{\circ} W$  Judge McBraydes flag staff  $N 13.5^{\circ} W$  a tree in bush at top of the survey called Kapeliwahine  $N 5.20^{\circ} E$  thence from Kawahaha  $N 10.57^{\circ} E$  5281 links crossing a gully and passing 60 links to the westward of North West corner of old stock yard to a stone with a split in it called Waipapa'oaia thence  $N 44^{\circ} E$  3317 links crossing a gully several times to a large rock, about 10 feet high with a split in it  this and called Kapouwa thence  $N 1.30^{\circ} E$  7100 links on up to bush to a large tree on the top of the ridge and called Kapeliwahine. The land above this is not accessible & without going to great expense in cutting lines through the bush cannot be surveyed further.

The Eastern Boundary of this land commences on the sea shore joining the south West corner of Lawai at a point called Manalua 208 links from top of pale at a stone thus

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R and runs N 0.30 E 6780 links, crossing a gully and point of rocks to a place called <sup>Ridge 0.45</sup> Lacahupila thence N 22.52 E 2457 links to a large pile of stones called Makaulu, thence N 9.41 E 3188 links to the top of a ridge called Kapuhikawa, thence N 24.33 E 2238 links down side of hill and over a pali to a rock called Upe, thence S 84.0 E 584 links crossing a stream and along the foot of a spur to side of stream called Haliopai, thence N 30.0 E 168 links crossing stream to a large stone, Haliopai, situated between two streams, thence N 9.47 E 792 links running up a sharp narrow spur to two stones set into the ground thence N 2.29 W 940 links along the East side of ridge to a tall stone set into the ground, thence N 13.8 W 1360 links to a stone with a knob set into the ground at a place called Mauihilo thence N 15.20 E 1020 links to three stones set into the ground, on the south side of the Government road, about twenty links west of a hole in the ground on the West side of Lawai Valley and called Kiakainahoa thence N 26.27 W 1506 links to a place called Hahiana thence N 39.33 W 749 links along the side of ridge to marks cut in the ground thence thence N 33.15 W 1680 links down the side of hill and across a hollow to the top of a ridge, thence N 33.0 W 439 links, thence N 16.27 E 1825 links along the top of a ridge thence N 8.0 E 1787 links down the side of a hill and crossing a gully and on to the top of a spur, thence N 3.12 W 456 links, thence N 9.0 W 1519 links crossing a gully and old road to the top of a spur called Tapana, thence N 12.38 W 1355 links to a place called Pitiale, thence N 19.14 W 410 links, thence N 17.34 W 826 links to a large rock called Lehu, thence N 21.0 W 282 links thence N 30.10 W 295 links to a large rock called Lehu, thence N 10.36 E 5400 links along over gully and up through a small clump of trees to a grassy spur running into the bush thence.
