I know the boundary of this land. I have always resided here, and know this land from sea beach to mountain. The N.E. boundary commences at a point on the beach called Naupohaka thence up to where the gods used to sacrifice & called Keahupohaka

From the foregoing evidence the following decision was rendered

Decision.

The North East boundary of this land commences on the sea shore at a place called Kaupaka, and thence runs up face of mountain to a place where the gods used to sacrifice called Kaupohaka thence to a resting place called Kaupaka, thence to high peak called Puhihi, thence to high peak Kalakua, thence to the highest peak on Eastern boundary called Alakalau, thence round ridge to Koala thence round ridge to Kahooloa, thence to ridge about center of valley Hoapepepe thence to junction with Waimea at Pihia, thence along waimea boundary to Alimui, continuing along waimea boundary to Kawailoa, and along same boundary to Puuhihi and from thence to a large and peculiarly shaped rock each side representing a land called Pohakua-waawa, at this rock the boundary of waimea terminates with this land, and the land then joins the boundary of Hinowai and Nualoa. From Pohakua-waawa the boundary runs to face of cliff at Kalahu thence to high peak with round hole through the top called Kaanapuka thence down precipice to Kalahu thence to peak Waikani, thence down to sea shore at a Kalaipihia, and from thence round to place of commencement
