

Kealia Boundary

The following decision was rendered on the 5th day of December A.M. 1870 but neglected to be entered

Commencing upon the sea shore at the South East corner of this land at rocks at low water mark, called Waieia which point is in a straight line with the Northely side of Kapoa river before it turns previous to entering the sea, from the above point following the sea to a small stream of water on Kumuakumu and thence passing up and around the Boundery of the land called Kumuakumu to the sea at the North East corner of Kumuakumu and from thence following the sea to a stream on the south bank at the entrance into the sea of the small stream or river called Kamalamala, which is the W.C. corner of land called Hoowakawaa. From the above point the Northely Boundery of these lands runs along south side of Kamalamala river to top edge of a certain hill, thence along near edge of pale bounding Hoowakawaa gulch on the South and along on top of ridge separating Hoowakawaa & Kamalamala gulch, thence passing along near north side of Kealia Auwai and from thence following always along near North side of Kealia Auwai to a point in the Auwai a short distance north of the crossing of the old mountain road on the edge of the bank of a small stream of water. From thence crossing said stream, and following along near said old mountain road to the entrance of said old mountain road into the forest thence following always along said mountain road up along on the top of the ridge bounding Kealia river on the North to a clearing on the ridge called Pohakuhapai. From thence passing along near top of ridge bounding Kealia valley on its northely side to the extreme north west corner of these lands

The Boundery on the south side, commencing from the sea shore at the South East corner of these lands at the place called Waieia crossing sandspit to Kapoa river and up along Northely side of said river in all its turnings and windings to where it crosses the Auwai called Makole

Note: Kumuakumu has since this decision been purchased by the Government

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Division Kealia Boundary continued

Thence passing up through the middle of the river to a thick
 tree on North side of the river near Makai of the corner
 of the Government road Thence to the Middle of the Waipaa
 river from thence up through the middle of the Waipaa river
 to the top of ridge at Junction of Waipaa and Kealia rivers
 and thence following up on middle of said ridge to an open
 clearing Thence to top of ridge bounding Minomina valley
 on the South from thence following along mountain on top of
 ridge to bluff where said ridge runs westerly called Pua
 ahu Thence following along top of said ridge bounding
 Minomina on the south and Kealia valley passing over
 mountain peak called Akaia to a tall sharp rocky peak
 called Pihiaipeli from thence following along on pali
 bounding Kealia valley on the south to a ridge on Makai
 side of a deep gulch running down into Kealia valley from
 thence following down said ridge and crossing Kealia river
 and valley to the North West corner of these lands

Decision rendered 13th Dec 1870

Commencing at two small stones in the ground, a short distance from a double stemmed tree of Cordia tree near the East bank of the Hanapepe river and following along the Eastern Bank of said Hanapepe river, thence crossing at a point of Hanapepe river, thence crossing the principal stream and running to the Eastern side of Waterfall the center of which forms the boundary of this land, thence following the said water lead to where it joins the Hanapepe river, thence following the river to the sea, thence crossing a sand spit and mouth of Hanapepe river to a rocky point overlooking the sea, thence returning on the Eastern Bank of the River in all its windings and turnings to place of commencement
