JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land
of Alohaena District of Puna Island of
Hawaii having been filed with me on the 15 day of September
1873 by Edwin O. Hall Minister of Interior

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of Henry Johnston agent for East Lands and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 106, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

The South East Boundary
of this land commences on the sea beach at
a place called Kekeke and from thence
mauka to Kulakuh, thence to Puhaw-
apo, thence to Kaehi-loka, thence to rock
on top of cliff looking like a dog house
thence up, over, and down face of hill to
single hala tree from thence to pond in
Marsh called Kamala, thence to Pohakaha
thence crossing numerous gulches and spurs
to top of Kamoohopule ridge thence up

said ridge to Kuhelaw, Thence up through
forest to Rapehuatua the head of this land
and junction with Rapaa.

The North West Boundary of this land
commences at a hole in the reef called Pohakua
Thence to hill of stones called Kaapunaakaali
Thence along old stone wall to swamps and over
swamp to Waialeale and old Kalu land, Thence
to Alalena Thence to Kalawikiwiki Thence
to Makana, Thence to Rapaa, Thence up
to ~~edge of woods~~ Paapuaa, Thence to Kulele-
pale, Thence to Puuopai Thence up to edge
of woods and up ridge to head of Waipouli
at a large Ohia tree, Thence up ridge to
Rapehuatua the head of this land and
junction with North East Boundary.

It is therefore adjudged and I do
hereby decide and certify that the boundaries
of the said land are and hereafter shall be
as herebefore set forth.
