JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land  
of Wailua District of Puna Island of  
Kauai having been filed with me on the 29 day of September  
1872 by J. C. Dominis Crown Commissioner and  
Land agent.

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

J. W. Mahalana agent for Crown Commissioner and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 32, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

Commences at a stone (Northern Boundary) on the brow of hill near the sea, called Kikike and from there westerly to a lot of stones called Kulakuhau, thence through centre of Haw. Bush Puhau-poo, to centre of barred ridge Kaihuololoa, thence up hill to a small open flat surrounded by Haw. bush and Koa trees called Kaia where ~~where~~ the bodies of those slain in battle were buried, thence up and over ridge to spring of water Kamooheawai, thence to a stone

on edge of pond called Kamala where Kaume-  
ali used to jump off when bathing Thence to  
a stream, marsh, and haw bush Kawaiपाल  
Thence to Hala Tree, Pohakua, Thence up valley  
and across stream to Kapukawaiwai, Thence  
up ridge to Kamohoopuu, Thence to Kuhilau  
Thence up ridge and on to Kalalea, Thence up  
ridge to top of mountain and junction of Koolau  
lands at a place called Kapuhuala, Thence  
along from peak to peak on ridge Pohakua  
to a place called Kahamahi where old road  
crosses the mountain ridge to Hawalei Thence  
along ridge from peak to peak to the extreme  
highest point of Mountain called Waialeale  
Thence down and along Hanamaulea boundary  
to the sea.

It is therefore adjudged and I do  
hereby decide and certify that the Boundaries  
of the said land are and hereinafter shall be  
as hereinbefore set forth

Decision in reference to the Boundary of  
the Ahupuaa of Wailea by Duncan M. Wryde  
Commissioner of Boundaries 12<sup>th</sup> Nov: 1873

Commencing on the Northern  
boundary at a stone on brow of hill near  
the sea called Kihike, and from there marked  
to a lot of stones called Kulakuhua, thence  
through centre of haw bush Puhauapo, to  
centre of bare red ridge Kaheholoia, thence  
up to a small open spot, surrounded by  
haw bush and Koa trees called Kasa  
where the bodies of those slain in battle  
were buried, thence up and over ridge to  
a spring of water Kamookuawai, thence to  
a stone on side of pond Kamala where Kau-  
maliu used to jump off when bathing, thence  
to a stream, marsh, and haw bush Kawaapa-  
lau thence to haw trees Pohakua, thence up  
valley and across stream to Kapukanawai-  
owailio, thence up ridge to Kamookoopulu  
thence to Kuhilau, thence up ridge and on  
to Kalalea, thence up ridge to top of moun-  
tain, and junction of Koolau lands to a  
place called Kapuhawala, thence along from  
peak to peak on ridge Pohakua to a  
place called Kakamohiki where old road

across the mountain ridge to Hanalei thence  
along ridge, from peak to peak to the extreme  
highest point Waialeale thence down and  
along Hanamaulea Boundary to the sea



\* Thence entering the bush and continuing along up the ridge by the land of Iohana to its most westerly point at a place called Kapehu (marked Makaleha on plan), thence continuing in a north westerly direction and round again in a westerly direction to a open leading S.W. to Waialeale mountain thence following down the land of Hanamaule to a ridge called Kaili'iahua'ali on the following bearings and distances S 84 E Magnetic 755 chains. Thence N 74 E (Magnetic) 93 chains to the south bank of the stream called Kamailow at the sea beach, thence following round to place of commencement, in a northerly direction and containing an area of 20,255 acres (Twenty Thousand two hundred and Fifty Five acres) more or less

Waialua Makai takes from this 2,800 acres which leaves in Waialua Maukae 17,455 acres (see plan of Waialua)

The bearings noted in the Northern Boundary of this land are on the true Meridian, those on the South Magnetic at all stations in the survey good marks have been put either three stones and a bottle lit into the ground <sup>stone</sup> <sup>stone</sup> <sup>stone</sup> thus, or three holes dug and bottle lit into the ground <sup>stone</sup> <sup>stone</sup> <sup>stone</sup> thus  <sup>hole</sup> <sup>hole</sup> <sup>hole</sup>

## Waialua Makai

The South East boundary commences at the south bank of the Kamailow Stream on the sea beach and runs thence S 74° E 93 chains to the top of ridge called Kailiilohivali to a large stone set into the ground thence following in a Northerly direction, the top of ridge to a dark pali on the south side of the Waialua river, thence down the pali to a large rock at its foot thence crossing the Waialua river in a Northerly direction to the narrowest place in open, where an old ditch is cut to serve as a fence, thence on in a Northerly direction across hollow and up spur of main ridge leading to Nono peaks thence 1200 links to North side of this land thence on the following bearings and distances to sea
