JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land  
of Nalakeo District of Koloa Island of  
Hawaii having been filed with me on the 8 day of July  
1873 by Geo. C. Dennis Crown Commissioner

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of J. W. Gay acting for Crown Commissioner and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 42, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

The western Boundary of this land commences at the sea beach at a point called Kohes and adjoining Wahawa at a stone the shape of an hourglass, thence to a place called Owahani, thence to a place called Keahua thence to a place Puulohole a heap of stones thence to Kaluakauhaka, thence to Kihawai now, thence to Makakawale, thence to a place called Nahalekii thence across several small gullies thence through dam at Boiling down Establishment and across government road

to a place called Kawaihaka where there is a large stone, Thence up past stock yard to a stone with a split in it called Waipapaiaia, Thence crossing a gully several times to a large rock with a split in it thus ~~is~~ called Kapuna, Thence up through bush to a large tree on top of ridge called Kapulewahine Thence the Boundary of this land goes through forest on a ridge to a high peak called Kihili

The Eastern Boundary of this land commences on the sea shore and adjoining Hawaii at a point called Manolou at a stone thus  Thence across a gully to a point of rocks and on to a place called Luawahinepila, Thence to a pile of stones called Makaulii, Thence to a place on top of ridge called Kapuhikau Thence down side of hill and over a small pale to a rock called Upoupa, Thence crossing a stream and along foot of spur to side of stream called Hali'opae, Thence running up a sharp narrow spur to two stones lit into the ground Thence along eastern side of ridge to a stone lit into the ground, Thence to a stone with a knob at a place called Maililou Thence to three stones lit into the ground on the south side of the government road, Thence to Hale ana Thence along side of ridge to a mark cut into the ground thus  Thence down side of hill and across hollow to the top of a ridge Thence along top of ridge and down the side of a hill crossing a gully and on to top

of a spur Thine crossing a gully and old road  
to the top of a spur called Rapana. Thence to  
a place called Rapana Pitale. Thence to a  
large rock called Leho. Thence to another rock  
called Leho. Thence across gully gully and up  
through a small clump of trees to a grassy  
spur running into the bush. Thence down the  
Eastern side of grassy spur and along side  
of range, to junction of Lawai with Kolow  
at a place in saddle of ridge called  
Thence along Kolow boundary to top of high  
peak Kahelu and junction with the Western  
Boundary

It is therefore adjudged and I do  
hereby decide and certify that the boundaries  
of the said land are and hereafter shall be  
as hereunto set forth

 N 4:40 E <sup>21 89.2</sup> 3314 fathoms crossing a gully several times to a large  
 rock about 10 feet high with a split in it (3 throes) and  
 called *Kapuna*. Thence

N 1:30 E <sup>45 86.0</sup> 7100 fathoms on up to bush to a large tree on the  
 top of the ridge and called *Kapilirahine*.

The land above this is not accessible and without  
 going to great expense in cutting lines through the bush, can  
 not be surveyed further.

The Eastern Boundary of this land commences  
 on the sea shore joining the South West corner of *Larrai*  
 at a point called *Manaloa* 208 fathoms from top of pali  
 at a *Heau* *thine* *R* and runs

 a place called *Irakinepila*, thence
- N 22:52 E <sup>16 71.6</sup> 2457 fathoms to a large pile of stones called *Irakaulii*
- N 9:41 E <sup>21 04.1</sup> 3188 fathoms to the top of a ridge called *Kapuhikaua*
- N 24:53 E <sup>8 25</sup> <sup>817.1</sup> 1238 fathoms down side of hill and over a pali to a rock  
<sup>35-37</sup> called *Mpo upo*
- S 84:10 E <sup>38 1.4</sup> 584 fathoms crossing a stream and along the foot of  
 a spur to side of stream called *Haliopai*
- N 30:00 E <sup>110.9</sup> 168 fathoms crossing stream to a large stone. *Haliopai*  
<sup>34 31</sup> situated between two streams, thence
- N 9:44 E <sup>522.7</sup> 792 fathoms running up a sharp narrow spur to two  
<sup>13-31</sup> stones set into the ground, thence
- N 2:29 W <sup>620.4</sup> 940 fathoms along the east side of ridge to a tall stone  
<sup>357-31</sup> set into the ground. Thence
- N 13:8 W <sup>6-14</sup> 1360 fathoms to a stone with a knob set into the ground  
<sup>34 6-32</sup> at a place called *Haililoa*, thence

 30 10 N 194.7 295 to a large rock also called *Leho*  
 10 36 E 356.4 5400 along across gully and up through a small  
 clump of trees to a grassy spur running into the bush
