JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land
of Hanalei District of Hanalei Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 14 day of July
1873 by John C. Dennis Crown Commissioner
and Land agent,

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of W. M. Bryde acting for Crown Commissioner and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 84, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

Commences at an opening in
the reef on half of which opening belongs to
Hanalei and the half to Kalihukui and calls
Holohoa and thence straight to sand beach
thence along sand beach to a rocky point called
Kalaihona thence mauka on ridge to Kaka-
huwa on broad Kula thence continuing on Kula
to Maakou hale, thence through Kulua land
to Kamolehua a ridge and thence to a broad
ridge with stones at Boundary called Kauai
and thence to a rocky ledge above Government

road called Kaulaahaka, thence to a small mound called Kapuakakua, thence through Kula land to Kapuhaili, thence to residing place and kula house of chief Kauanohi, thence to a place where natives used to start from, when passing to the beach and called Kaumuaakolea, thence up a sharp narrow ridge between two gulches called Kapualianini, thence continuing up said ridge to Kapualikashi, thence to a small stream Kaherawai, thence up a flat ridge Maheani with Banana trees, thence to a large and peculiarly shaped stone at an old place of worship (Heau) called Kapaka here ends Kalihinua and commencement of Kalihinua with Hanalei, the Boundary then crosses a small stream which runs into Kalihinua river called Kauaipulea, and thence to Waialeale. Between the two last named stations none of the witnesses examined could give any name of stations, from Waialeale runs down that of Wainia till it joins Wainiha and Lunaha land thence down Lunaha Boundary till junction with Waile and thence down Waile to the sea.

It is therefore adjudged and I do hereby decide and certify that the Boundaries of the said land are and hereafter shall be as herebefore set forth.

Notes of Survey of the Ahupua'a of Hoanalei

The W. West corner of this land commences on the sea beach at a place called Manolan where a tall stone is let into the ground with broken bottle beneath said from whence the following places bear an Orange tree on the ridge at the head of Wairoko and called *Maooa* S 70° 44' true 161' 45" Mag. Peapea Peak on West boundary of Waiolo S 39° 55' true (S 30° 53' true Mag) a tall stone on point of spur below Peapea S 58° 23' true (S 49° 21' true Mag)

From thence the western boundary of this land runs as follows

This is as far as the boundary can be defined but if continued further at any future period lines will have to be cut, and the watershed of the ridge surveyed as far as Maialeale. The area is 5922 acres.

The quantities computed is that within the lines surveyed.

The bearings herein noted are true taken from Meridian at N. West corner of this land.

At nearly all stations there have been trenches cut - Y thro - a stone put into the ground.

I hereby certify that this is a correct survey of the boundaries of this land as decided by Hawaiian & English Commissioners of Boundaries for the Island of Hawaii
