JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land
of Hanakapūai District of Hanalei Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 15 day of November
1873 by Edwin O. Hall Minister of Interior

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

Henry Johnston agent for Government Lands and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 111, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

The Boundary of this land commences on the sea shore at a place called Waikōama and thence to a place called Kōkūapūai thence to a ridge called Laukaia, thence up ridge to point on hill at a place called Namanamana thence following up same ridge to point on hill called Pōkōkō thence up ridge to Peak called Puanui, thence up same ridge to Peak Kalapakalulu thence up ridge to Alūiui the furthest point of Hanalei and the junction of this land with

Wainiha Thence continuing up along Wainiha
to a peak Haha Thence up through forest
to peak Waiau, Thence to Alakai the
highest point on Eastern Boundary. Thence
round the head of this land to Kapioa the
commencement of Western Boundary. Thence down
Western Boundary to a cave in cliff called
Halehula Thence down to Peak Kooa
Thence continuing down ridge to Peak Pohaku
akani. Thence down ridge to Peak Pohakua
Thence to peak on ridge Hoolulu Thence to
a rock where the gods used to meet and called
Kailua Thence to a trickling stream on the
sea shore and called Waipunahewa, and thence
round to place of commencement.

It is therefore adjudged and I do
verbly decide and certify that the Boundaries
of the said land are and hereafter shall be as
heretofore set forth
