I beg to acknowledge your letter of 16<sup>th</sup> inst informing me that application had been made to you by Charles R. Bishop and G. Kana'ina Guardians of W. to L. Lunalilo to have the Boundaries of Waipouli situated in the District of Puna settled and defined

I would now make application to have the boundaries of the Ahupuaa of Kapoa on Kauai defined and settled at the same time. The side adjoining Keala is already fixed

I also wish to have the boundaries of the Ahupuaa of Wailua on Kauai defined if it can be done at the same time

## Boundary of the Ahupuaa of Waialea

## Kaleu Sworn

I live at Waialea was born there know boundary of Waialea. Makai it commences in a blow hole in the rocks on sea shore, my father showed me this as the Boundary I and those showed Mr Pease - the Boundary

## Kee Sworn

I know the boundary of Waialea it commences on the sand beach, when fish were drawn in on that part of the sand they were divided with Olohuwa, the Blow hole and the god: Kane of Kealahou are on Olohuwa, Kealahou house was also on Olohuwa.

## Decision

Commences at a stone (Northern Boundary) on the brow of hill near the sea, called Kihike and from there Makai to a lot of stones called Kulahuhu thence through center of low bush Puhauopo, to center of low red ridge Kaihauoloia thence up hill to a small open spot surrounded by low bush and low trees called Kava where the bodies of those slain in battle were buried, thence up and over ridge to a spring of water Kamohuewai, thence to a stone on side of pond <sup>where</sup> Kaunualii used to jump off when bathing, thence to a stream marsh and low bush, Kawaiपालae, thence to Halatua Pokahaka thence up valley and across stream to Kapuka. maowaliolia thence up ridge to Kamohoopulu thence to Kubilai, thence up ridge and on to Kalalea thence up ridge to top of mountain and junction of Koolau lands at a place called Kapuhuala thence along from peak to peak on ridge Pohakua to a place called Kakaemahiki where old road crosses the mountain ridge to Hawalei thence along ridge from peak to peak to the extreme highest point of Mountain called Waialeale thence down and along Hamamianu boundary to the sea.

at 4000 links passing top of sand slip & large stone to Kaikua Lohia. Here tree  
up spur and cliff to projecting stone appearing from below like a dog house  
up spur to narrow place in ridge called Kaea  
to the top of range 1300 links North of Nona Peak  
down side of hill & crossing gully Apua to Kamala hula tree (?)  
crossing government road to stone on bank of water hole called Kamala  
crossing gully several times and swamp Kapuipalau and through the south  
of haw trees to some hula trees Pohakua  
crossing ridge and then up a gully called Kapuhuanawawalele  
to ridge from whence bear  
along up ridge called Kamahoopalau  
and through clumps of haw trees  
crossing over side of ridge and up gully to Apua

up ridge to where it is narrow  
to edge of thick bush from whence bear  
Nona Peak N. 28.54 E. Pohakupuili  
Ahahaka N 11.20 W Makaleha

thence entering the bush and continuing  
along up the ridge by the land of Ohuwa to its most westerly  
point at a place called Kapuhua (marked Makaleha) on flow  
thence continuing in a north westerly direction to a spur  
bearing and round again in a westerly direction to a spur

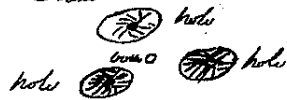
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## Boundary of the Ahupuaa of Wailea

Leading SW to Waialeale mountain thence following down the land of Hanamaulu to a ridge called "Kailiiahine" on the following bearings and distances S 84. E Magnitic 755 chains thence N 74 E (Magnitic) 93 chains to the south bank of the stream called Kamailow at the sea beach thence following round to place of commencement in a Northerly direction and containing an area of 20,255 acres Twenty Thousand two hundred and Fifty Five acres more or less.

Wailea Makai takes from this 2,800 which leaves in Wailea mauka 17,455 acres see plan of Wailea

## Wailea Makai

The south east boundary commences at the south bank of the Kamailow stream on the sea beach and runs thence S 74. E 93 chains to the top of ridge called Kailiiahine to a large stone set into the ground thence following in a Northerly direction, the top of ridge to a dark pali on the south side of the waialeale river, thence down the pali to a large rock at its foot thence crossing the Waialeale river in a Northerly direction to the narrowest place in space where an old ditch is cut to serve as a fence, thence on in a Northerly direction, across hollow and up spur of main ridge leading to New peak thence N 1200 links to North side of this land thence on the following bearings and distances to sea coast.
