Dear Sir

I have respectfully to request that you will at your convenience define and settle the boundaries of the land known as Lumahaia in Hanalei Hawaii. It is bounded on one side by Waimiha belonging to a company of natives and on the other side by lands Waihohe and Waihoan owned or leased by Miller, and Maohai by the sea

Perhaps you will set a time for the hearing that will suit the convenience of McGay the surveyor, as I am in no hurry to have it done the owners of the adjoining lands ought I think to share in the expense of the adjustment of dividing lines

If the Mejors succeeds and others who may have lands joining his Magestys land of Manuahi beside to Mr Knudsen will apply to have their boundaries settled or share in the expense you will please settle and define that land also. It was surveyed by the late Mr Pease and I will send you a copy of his work in a short time

Yours of the 25 inst is at hand. McGay has been sick but is now better and will go to Honolulu in a few days. I will pay for the settlement of the boundaries of Piloa and Waihoan when you send your bill. I will enclose the survey of Manuahi now but am in no hurry about the settlement of its boundaries

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Thereupon appointed the 14th day of November A.D. 1876 for the hearing of said petition and caused notice to be served on the owners of the adjoining lands of the town and place

The boundary of the Ahupuaa and Manuahi
 commences at the river side at a place called Waipohu and
 thence up the hill side, to a place on top of ridge called Ko-
Kahai thence to Kahipa junction of Manuahi and Hanapepe
 thence across a gulch Kahai to a ridge called Kahai where
 the boundary of Manuahi joins Makoahele. This is the old or
 ancient boundary.

Orono Examined

I never found of the boundary going to Amama. Then formerly
 lived Kuhapua in Manuahi. Wahunsa the former Konohiki
 of Hanapepe never told me that the boundary went to Amama.
 I was born here and was born under the Konohiki, and
 always went for the men to come to work, when born in
Hanapepe many natives lived between Waipohu and Amama
 and they never came to work in Hanapepe, always work
 in Manuahi. Kupea was Konohiki before Wahunsa
 he also showed me the boundary as I now describe it. But
Kupea was a much older man than either. Kupea
 went along with Wahunsa to show him the boundary

Decision

The Boundary of the land commences at its SE corner at its
 junction of Koula and Manuahi streams and runs thence
 along the north side of Manuahi stream to foot of Opai at a

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follow called Malapunaheia thence up to top of Knoll called Puuhuaheia
thence up along ridge to old Heau, said Heau being in Manuahi, thence
up edge of pale and through quava bushes to open gravel, thence down
side of hill to hole called Kuapoo, thence crossing gully and up
to high peak in bush called Manuahi, thence along side of hill
to a place called Manuahi, thence along ridge Kalaei and down to
the west side of Waterfall called Maalulu, thence along west bank
of stream to a place called Olamaheia, thence up a ridge running
in a westerly direction to top of Peak called Puuleheia the
North west corner of this land

The south boundary runs along the bank of the
Hanapepe stream to a place called Waipahu thence up face
of pale and on up ridge to Koepoala and thence on to Koehuaheia
at which place this land joins Maheuaheia, thence the boundary
follows Maheuaheia along water side of ridge to Kakapa, thence
to Kakahaie, thence on from peak to peak on ridge till its
junction with the eastern boundary at Puuleheia
