Thereupon appointed the 26th day of May A.D. 1874 for the hearing of said petition and caused the owners of the adjoining lands to be notified of the time and place of hearing

Kauniahiki Stream

Follows on plain to road crosses this, thence to

Pehupohoriki

This boundary commences on the sea shore where
 we used to sacrifice in olden times and is called *Kuakahe*
 Thence to, a place in plain or resting place
 whole
 " a ridge on face of hill *Kahakolekole*
 " follows up ridge to top of hill *Kihoo*
 " to point on hill one side *Alomani* *Kiisamaakua*
 " hill one side *Papaa* the *Anahola* *Puu*
 " up ridge *Pukeaha*
 " a road comes up by *Keaba* goes to *Kelawai* *Keaopou*
 " high peak boundary runs over top *Malamalamaki*
 " boundary runs over three peaks *Namahana*
 " a road, near boundary joins *Kelekewa* *Kaumuku*
 " a deep gulch dug out in *Elililoa* &
 commencement of *Kamalamala* } *Kaleomahaumu*

The boundary then runs down the Eastern
 side through a flat called +
 then round on small ridge to mark at
 " through wood to a large open plain or flat
 " to a large open space

 " to a large basin or pond $\frac{1}{2}$ to *Ano*

Notes of Survey of the Ahupua'a of Anahole

The W. E. corner of this land commences at the sea shore at a stone at a place called "Kuaehu" and runs thence S 77° 50' W 364 links up to top of terraces from thence the following places near Anahole Peak S 63° 17' W true (S 56° 16' W) Mag. Nino Peak on Water S 25° 11' W true (S 16° 10' W) Mag. a rocky peak N 84° 15' W true) thence the Northern boundary of this land runs as follows

S 17° 18' W	2214	up across flat to stones marked \times in the ground
S 71° 54' W	2782	" " to 3 stones.
S 69° 23' W	2146	crossing low road to Akole marked \times ^{stone}
S 73° 13' W	6050	" gullies & past Koahelehole to Hekeo

thence the south boundary of this land runs

 S 80° 39' W 7370 & crossing gullies to Apulei

 N 74° 49' W 2525 crossing stream and top of spur called Healia

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Boundary of the Ahupuaa of Anahulu.

N 74.9° W 1920 to stone at the edge of forest land and called *Wahine
akamalii*

N 84.30° W 3900 up through forest to open space above the Anahulu stream
and called *Puuawa*.

S 7.0° W 400 along open space

S 83.0° W 3400 links up along water shed of ridge through woods

S 63.° W 12600 to Puuwa the south west corner of this land + NW
corner of Keala from Puuawa to Puuwa the water shed of the
ridge is the boundary of this land (see plan of Anahulu)

When the lines on plan are only dotted thus - . - . - . - it sig-
nifies that the ridge of hills is the boundary but when drawn
in full, the line is to be taken as the boundary

The bearings herein recorded are on the true Meridian
of Grove Farm Naulivili

At all the stations outside of the woods there has been
stone set and marked thus ↑
