Nakulala Stream

The boundary of this land commences at the sea at a place
 Kawaiapapa. Thence to ridge called Keohala
 Thence to a poaka called Puuopou
 " along flat land to stone called Pohakuwaawoa
 " through woods called Ihi
 " down to a gorge or gulch called Makalani
 " down through valley of Neulolo into }
 " ridge on other side of poaka called } Makalani
 " to poaka at round stone Napohakau
 " down to a large rock called Hoonoo
 " to house lot called Nulikale
 " to sea at place called pipi Pipi
 " to rocks in sea one of which is in }
 Neulolo & the other in Wawapuhi } Kaunihohaku

Milikoa Stream

The western boundary of this land commences in
 the sea at a stone called Kaunihohaku
 Thence to a stone on ridge & side of pali Hoonoo
 " to two stones in cliff Napohakau
 " to a gulch or gorge Makalani
 " to a spring on top of bluff Kupunawaipohaku
 " to a piece of woody land on cliff Ihi
 " to a large stone on flat land Pohakuwaawoa
 " to a poaka Puuopou
 " down to a gorge above sand }
 beach where stream rushes down }
 and called Kawaiapapa
 " to a spring at edge of the sea called Kupunawaianai

 our members of Neulolo waters the following decision regarding
 the boundary of Wawapuhi was rendered.

Boundary of the Ahupuaa of Wawapukii Decision

The Eastern boundary of this land commences on the sea shore at a place called Kawaipapa. Thence to a ridge called Keoahala, thence to a psala called Puumoou thence along flat land through forest to a rock where several lands join and called Pohakuwawaa, thence through woods called Ihi, thence to a spring on top of cliff & called Kapunawaihohaka. Thence to a gulch or gorge called Makalani, thence down ridge to Nekalala thence to two stones on side of cliff called Napohakau. Thence down to a large rock on side of psala called Hoouo thence to house lots called Mulehale, thence to sea at a place called Pippi, thence to two rocks in sea one of which belongs to Keulolo and the other to Wawapukii and called Kaupihohaka, and from there round to place of commencement.
