JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land
of Lumakahi District of Hanalei Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 7 day of August
1873 by Charles R. Bishop

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of

James W. Gay acting for Charles R. Bishop and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 37, and it appearing to my satisfaction, that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

The North Western boundary of this land commences on the sea shore at a place called Kahoolinapakai, and from thence up the side of hill to ridge Kolohole and thence up and along ridge to a Sauhalu tree at Kaluabee Thence along ridge to Waiamea, Thence to Hala tree at Kaluamaukai Thence across gulch and up ridge to a place called Kalawile, Thence up ridge to peak Moi Thence up ridge to peak Hilele, Thence up ridge to peak Pepiwa Thence up ridge to

Kahililoa. Thence up to gulch Kioulā + Kawailā,
Thence up ridge to Waluapohakukēa. Thence
along ridge to Kawailoa, Thence to Hapounpau
Thence up to Pulehā the junction of this land
with Hanalei, Thence down the Eastern Bound-
ary to Namoolohama Thence down to Kapāi-
lu Thence down to high hill Niki, Thence
down to Thence down to Kolopou, Thence con-
tinuing down ridge to Kekeawailā Thence
down to orange trees at Kaooa the junction
of Waipoo and Waikāka, Thence down ridge
to Pohakūpili, Thence to Piuhamaakāka
Thence down to Lepohā, Thence down to
Kalahala, Thence to sea and round to place
of commencement.

It is therefore adjudged and I do hereby
decide and certify that the boundaries of the
said land are and hereafter shall be as
hereby set forth.

Notes of Survey of Kumabrae, situated on the Island of Hawaii

The North East corner of this land commences on the sea shore at a rocky point called *Prabalabala*, and runs thence

1. 21' N 2000 chains & 10 links crossing over the top of a conical hill close to the beach and on to top of spur called *Lepahua*. Thence
2. 74' 16" N 760 links along the ridge, thence
3. 69' 11" N 1900 " to *Puubranawakea* thence
4. 10' 58" N 3200 " passing *Pohakupili* a large prominent stone on the spur. Thence
5. 25' 50" N 9460 " Thence
6. 7' 19" E 5820 " to *Keokianakua*. Thence
7. 15' 9" N 3950 " along the ridge. Thence
8. 26' 6" E 1540 " up the ridge to stony peak or knole called *Kolopuu*. Thence
9. 30' 36" E 9460 " to a peak called *Puubranawakea* (appearing thus) the ridge to the west of the bearing is the boundary
10. 86' 36" E 3860 links along the ridge to *Tekei* or *Kamalama*.
11. 24' 10" E 41 chains 20 links to a peak called *Kapailu*
12. 36' 45" E 3240 links to a peak called *Halaula*.
13. 40' E 2440 " to sharp peak. Thence
14. 34' 30" E 3360 " to the top of Mountain *Kamoolokama*

Returning to place of commencement at *Prabalabala*, the Northern Boundary of this land runs

N 75° 41' W 5300 fms along sandy beach and crossing river and
 on up to the top of spur called KoloKolo. Thence
 N 49° 52' W over the face of pali to sea shore, distance about
 1/2 mi. Thence from KoloKolo the boundary runs
 S 40° 10' W 1200 fms along the ridge. Thence
 S 52° 5' W 379 " along ridge to Makai side of road crossing
 spur. Thence
 S 29° 20' W 409 " "
 S 41° 4' W 879 " along the ridge to place called KaaLuakoo
 S 8° 28' W 967 " along ridge to Maianu
 S 19° 36' W 1122 " along the ridge and 100 fms west of some
 Koutrala trees
 S 11° 1' W 1190 " along ridge where there is a Koutrala
 and a large hole called KaaLuamaikai
 S 39° ³⁴ 34' W 1360 " crossing a gully and over on to the point
 of Spur
 S 71° W 1220 " up spur
 S 81° 55' W 418 " " "
 S 75° 46' W 491 " "
 S 39° 0' W 794 " "
 S 87° 16' W 961 " "
 N 76° 36' W 428 " to the top of spur
 S 37° 6' W 978 " up the ridge
 S 84° 24' W 169 " to the top of Kealamele
 S 4° 28' W 3800 " to Moai (the boundary from Kealamele
 follows along water shed of ridge up and round the head of
 Humatua valley and down to the beach at KaaLuakoo)
 S 16° 24' W 3500 fms to Helele
 S 6° 54' W 5760 " to Pipirai
 S 5° 39' W 6440 " to KahaLiloa
 S 14° 36' W 5000 " to Keoula, thence in a South

East direction along the ridge to gulch called Kairaialea
Thence up the ridge going around the gulch to a place
called Kahuapevra-kulua. Thence along ridge to Kairai
loa. Thence Kapeupuu. Thence along the ridge to
Palehua the junction with Kawalei, which is the
South East corner of this land. Thence following
round range of Mountains in a North West direction to
Kamoolokama the end of Survey, on the eastern boundary
of this land, (see plan) and containing an area of Three
Thousand, one Hundred and Fifty acres more or
less (3150 acres)

N. B. At all practicable places on this Survey and
when desirable marks have been put in the ground, either
a stone with broken bottle beneath or a trench with a
broken bottle in the center of them

N 1° 21' W 2000 chains & 10 Links crossing over the top of a conical
hill close to the beach and on to top of
spur called Lepahu Thence

S 74° 16' W 760 Links along the ridge, thence

S 69° 11' W 1300 " to Puuhanauakea thence

S 10° 58' W 3200 " passing Pohakupili a large prominent stone on
the spur. Thence

S 25° 50' W 2460 " thence

S 37° 6' W 978 Links up the ridge

S 84° 24' W 169 " to the top of Kealaweke

S 4° 28' W 3800 " to Moi (the boundary from Kealaweke follows
along water shed of ridge up and round the head
of Lumahai valley and down to the beach at
Kahalahala)

S 16° 24' W 3500 Links to Hilele

S 6° 54' W 5760 " to Pipiwai

S 5° 39' W 6440 " to Kahililoa

S 14° 36' E 5000 " to Keoula, thence in a South East direction along
the ridge to gulch called Kawaialea

Thence up the ridge going around the gulch to a place called
Kaluapohakukei. Thence along ridge to Kawailoa. Thence Hapuupuu.
Thence along the ridge to Palehua the junction with Hanalei, which
is the South East corner of this Land. Thence following round range
of Mountains in a North West direction to Namoolokama the end of Survey,
on the eastern boundary of this land, (see plan) and containing an area
of Three Thousand one Hundred and Fifty acres more or less (3150 acres)

N. B. At all practicable places on this Survey and when desir-
able marks have been put in the ground, either a stone with broken

bottle beneath or a trench with a broken bottle in the centre thus
