JUDGMENT.

An application to decide and certify the Boundaries of the Land
of Waiale District of Hanalei Island of
Kauai having been filed with me on the 13 day of September
1873 by Edwin D. Hall

in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c., approved on the 22d day of June, A. D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having gone on the said land, at the request of Henry Johnston agent for Government Lands on K and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 1, page 56, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries, are as follows, viz:

The North west Boundary of this land commences at a Rock out in the sea called Kalapa from thence to a place in the east bank of the stream called Kapeua, thence across stream to stone at foot of hill called Makaihua, thence to top of hill called same name Makaihua, thence up and along ridge to Peak called Peapa, thence up ridge to peak Kapaleka, thence up ridge to junction with Lumahu at Neki thence along ridge

to Peak on hill Kapaileu Thence to hill or
Peak Halaileu Thence to Molokama. Thence
to Peak Kanaenae the most western point
on the boundary of this land Thence following
round the head of Valley to commencement of
Eastern Boundary to a place on high hill
called Puekohaka. Thence down the ridge to
Puekii Thence down ridge to little green hill
called Hoaelele. Thence down and round ridge
to Mookoleaka. Thence following down ridge
to flat Kalo land Kuhumana near Ohia
trees and thence down and along an old bank
on Kuaunua to a place on Government Road
called Naunua. Thence to a place in the
sea called Manolae and round to place
of commencement.

It is therefore adjudged and I do
hereby decide and certify that the Boundaries
of the said land are and hereafter shall be
as hereintofore set forth.

Notes of Survey of Waialea, Kauai by James W. Gay

The North East corner of this land commences on the sea shore of Hanalei harbor at a stone set into the ground and from thence the following objects bear. An Orange tree on the ridge at the head of Waikoloa and called Kavaa S¹/₂ 70:4 1/2 true (61:45' N. Mag.) A Peak called Peapea on the Western boundary of this land S¹/₂ 39:53' N true (S¹/₂ 39:53' Mag.) a potatoe on point of hill below Peapea S¹/₂ 58:23' true (49:21' Mag.)

The Eastern boundary runs thence

1	S ¹ / ₂ 26:44' ^{true} E 1010	Links (35:46' Mag.)	through a grove of Quava bushes and across Government Road and just within Johnson's Paddock, Thence
2	S ¹ / ₂ 20: 1/2 E 1405	Links	crossing through Johnson's Paddock to the end of an old Kuauna. Thence
3	S ¹ / ₂ 23:44' E 1569	Links	following along old Kuauna and haw tree fence to Kalo patches. Thence
4	S ¹ / ₂ 9:21' E 1400	Links	crossing through Kalo patches to foot of a spur and thence up said spur to place called Kihimama

① S 84° 25' E 549 Links flat
 ② S 85° 25' E 316 to top of a peak at junction of ridge leading toward the flat, and at this place there is a mark cut in the ground and filled with stones and in the center a broken bottle. This marked. Thence the boundary follows along the watershed of Mooleaka Ridge on the following bearings and distances

- ③ S 23° 15' W 2400 Links
- ④ S 44° 30' E 2240 to the edge of the woods. Thence
- ⑤ S 69° 30' E 1240 up the ridge through woods to junction of main range leading down from Mountain
- ⑥ S 6° 30' W 2220 up watershed of main ridge to Kaaleke Peak. Thence
- ⑦ S 35° 30' W 1500 to sharp Peak Kihimann. Thence
- ⑧ South 1100 to sharp Peak called Pukii. Thence
- ⑨ S 26° 30' W 3140 to sharp Peak called Pukokala.

Thence following round in a South West by direction the watershed of range to a Peak called Kamaerua (see plan) which is the South east end of this land.

* Returning to place of commencement the North boundary follows along the sea shore

- ① S 74° 15' W 3412 Links to a long stone set into the ground which is the N.W. corner of this land. Thence the West Boundary runs
- ② S 11° 4' E 401 Links to a place called Kapuaa on the river bank
- ③ S 40° 59' W 1100 crossing the river and on to foot of spur called Orakairuaa. Thence
- ④ S 19° 35' W 1140 up face of spur to a stone set into ground.
- ⑤ S 33° 2' W 1290 up the spur the water head being the boundary
- ⑥ S 2° 45' W 2080 to Peak called Peapea
- ⑦ S 63° 8' W 1850 along ridge to Peak

S 8:15 N	2400	Links to a sharp Peak.
S 16:54 N	2120	Following round the head of spur to edge of woods
S 5:35 N	4260	up the usual spur to Kapaleka.
S 20:15 E	1980

⁽³⁹⁾ Thence following round in an easterly direction the watershed of ridge to a peak called Kanaemae, which is the South East corner of the land (see plan) and containing an area of Three Thousand Three Hundred and Fifty acres more or less (3350)

A.R. All stations where practicable there is a mark put either a stone bottle below, or else a trench Y with bottle broken and put down in the centre
