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Notes of Survey of the Ahupuaa of Hoanapepe

The Eastern boundary of this land commences on the sea shore at the S West corner of Mahianna at a point called Brenakua at which place is an arch in the rock or cliff with the sea washing through it. At 95 links from top of Pali on the boundary line the following objects bear Ahualiku Peak $N 4^{\circ} 43' E$ Puukapele $N 82^{\circ} 25' W$ Punahoni Peak $N 16^{\circ} 12' W$ Pohakua Peak, on this boundary line $N 24^{\circ} 52' E$. Thence from 95 links on this line

| $N 44^{\circ} 23' E$ | 5753 | (crossing at 5670 links and 60 links to the neck of a gateway a stone wall enclosing a land owned by Mr. Dorrell) to a large stone and called Kopeunahoa. |

Thence the following objects bear Ahualiku Peak
 $N 49^{\circ} 13' W$ Pohakua $N 13^{\circ} 54' E$. Thence from Kopeunahoa $N 28^{\circ} 16' E$ (needle $39^{\circ} 13'$) 3900 links to Poiakui. Thence
 $N 14^{\circ} 49' E$ 2800 links to place called Punakala

(at 1700 links on this line passes the N. West corner of Ahualitua now occupied by the Ronobiki of this land.) Thence from Puuohala N 5° 10' E 3935 links to sharp spur leading down from Pohakea and called Kuehivua. Thence N 2° 34' E 2100 " to Pohakea there a hole has been cut in the rock. The Boundary runs along the ridge to the eastward of the bearing given (see plan)

Thence the following objects bear Ahualitua Peak S 86° 56' W a sharp Peak on the Makareli boundary towards Maialeale N 1° 54' W. Puuhapele N 49° 48' W. Thence from Pohakea following along the ridge to a Peak bearing N 9° 10' E 6300 links and called Pohakiki. Thence following along the ridge to a clear Knoll in the bush to a large Hoa tree standing alone N 33° 14' E 3400 links. Thence along the edge to the top of Purauwaka N 74° 45' E 3200 links

From thence continuing along the ridge until joining spur leading from Kahiki Peak to Makareli. Thence in a N.W. direction along the ridge until joining the spur leading up the western boundary of this land and eastern boundary of Makareli.

The western boundary of this land I will describe as starting from Ahualitua Peak, a place well known and easily found. The Boundary from Ahualitua Peak runs

Thence continuing along the ridge until joining
the Spur leading from Wahiti Peak.

Returning again to Ahualika Peak, the Boundary runs
S 39° 27' W 325-00 links to two flat stones at old roadway, thence
S 36° 31' W 2740 to the sea shore, thence following
along the shore in an easterly direction to place of commence-
ment (see plan)

Within this land are situated the lands of
Kelele, Kuiuoa, Mammahi, Koula and a land owned
by Mr. Powell. Therefore the area is not given in survey

The South West corner of this land commences at the

junction of the Houla and Maunahi streams from whence
the westerly boundary of the land runs along the land of
Maunahi on the following notes

1. $29^{\circ} 36' E$ 476 links ↘ open grass land
2. $74^{\circ} 1' E$ 2222 ↘ down side of hill to a hole in ground
called Puapoo; there are two holes, the upper one is on the boundary
3. $38^{\circ} 13' E$ 2000 ↗ up the face of hill to the top of peak called
Hauaea and from whence the following peaks bear
4. $19^{\circ} 30' E$ (true) $9^{\circ} 30'$ Mag. a sharp Peak called Puulehua
at the North corner of Maunahii and adjoining Makameli.
5. $33^{\circ} 43' E$ (true) the North end of a ridge called Kalaia the
watershed of said ridge forms the boundary between this land
and Maunahii, thence from Maunaea
6. $80^{\circ} 8' W$ 2200 links along the ridge. This is as far as it is
advisable to carry the survey positive, beyond this the land is
rough and thickly wooded but by the following description and
reference to accompanying plan at any future time the boundary
by survey can be more definitely stated. The boundary from
2200 links true run round the side of range above the pali
to the South end of the Kalaia ridge. Thence along the
watershed of Kalaia ridge to its North end thence ↘ down
to the S.W. side of stream, and then continuing up the West
bank of stream to Hoalulu Waterfall. Thence along
West bank of stream to a place called Oloraraha from
thence up a ridge leading to the top of Puulehua the
North end of Maunahii. Thence following along the ridge
in a N.E. direction towards Waialalo to where a ridge
branches off and runs in a S.E. direction towards Kaluhi
From thence in about a S.E. direction to a round hill in
the saddle called Waibama. Thence in a S.E. direction
along ridge to Puuanaraha. Thence along ridge to
a high sharp peak called Kapapa which is the
N.W. corner of Mahana and N.E. corner of this land.

Returning place of commencement, the western boundary of this land runs thus

- $\sqrt{8} \begin{matrix} 62^{\circ} 45' 6'' \\ 62^{\circ} 45' 6'' \end{matrix}$ 457 ²⁹⁷ links to the top of rocky point called Papakea
- $\sqrt{4} \begin{matrix} 55^{\circ} 25' 6'' \\ 55^{\circ} 25' 6'' \end{matrix}$ 360 ^{237.6} along ridge. Thence
- $\sqrt{4} \begin{matrix} 84^{\circ} 59' 6'' \\ 84^{\circ} 59' 6'' \end{matrix}$ 665 ^{439.9} up ridge to Ho. Russell's land
- $\sqrt{4} \begin{matrix} 26^{\circ} 10' 6'' \\ 26^{\circ} 10' 6'' \end{matrix}$ 4200 ²⁷⁷² along the low hill to a point called Pratrava
- $\sqrt{4} \begin{matrix} 89^{\circ} 37' 6'' \\ 89^{\circ} 37' 6'' \end{matrix}$ 4700 ³⁰²¹ up the hill to the top of Puraukai, bounded on the south by Ho. Russell's land. Thence
- $\sqrt{4} \begin{matrix} 14^{\circ} 45' 6'' \\ 14^{\circ} 45' 6'' \end{matrix}$ 3200 ²¹¹⁴ links to the top of Purauka, bounded on the East by Wahiarra.
- $\sqrt{4} \begin{matrix} 58^{\circ} 30' 6'' \\ 58^{\circ} 30' 6'' \end{matrix}$ 12000 ⁷⁹²⁰ to the top of a Peak on ridge called Hulua
- $\sqrt{4} \begin{matrix} 44^{\circ} 45' 6'' \\ 44^{\circ} 45' 6'' \end{matrix}$ 7000 ⁴⁶²⁰ to the top of a sharp Peak at the N.W. corner of Wahiarra, and called Prapava, which is the N.E. corner of this land.

From Puraukai, the boundary between this land and Wahiarra is the watershed of the ridge (clef) and
